TRIBUTE TO MS. ERCELLEN CUMMINGS-ARCHIBALD ---- by Past President Sheila (Georges) DeGannes

"Shakespeare said, "All the world's a stage And all the men and women merely players: They have their exits and their entrances; And one man in his time plays many parts"

Ms. Ercellen Cummings-Archibald in her time played many parts: daughter, mother, student, teacher, Head Mistress and more. My relationship with Ms. Cummings was brief, productive and rewarding. We met by correspondence during my tenure as President of St. Rose's Alumni Association, Toronto, from 2011 to 2015, and she was Head Mistress at St. Rose's. I was privileged to communicate with Ms. Cummings during the culminating years of her nine-year leadership role at the school. I was always impressed with her fierce determination to do and to seek every opportunity to acquire the best for her students. She struck me as a human being who always strove to achieve the best within the circumstances of the times. As she herself once reported, "The realities impacted significantly as we faced our financial constraints and tried our best to implement programs." It was a joy to finally meet Ms. Cummings in person during the 20th. Anniversary Celebrations of the U.S.A. Chapter of our Alumni Association held in New York over the Labour Day weekend in 2012. She was so very warm and welcoming. I remember during that visit to New York I got a glimpse of Ms. Cummings, the daughter, as her mother who lived in New York, 'took in' unexpectedly, was hospitalized and eventually passed away. Ms. Cummings spent long hours at her mother's bedside and I was touched by her caring concern and expressions of tremendous gratitude to have been in New York at that time as her mother's health declined.

I remember Ms. Cummings as the proud parent when her son was called to the bar as a lawyer in Georgetown. I remember the glimpse into her mind-set as a student, albeit a graduating student, when she told the 2011 graduating class at Prize Giving, "Graduation is wonderful too because it is another step toward upward mobility... Today reminds me of how I felt years ago when I graduated from the University of Guyana." But it was in her role as Head Mistress and School Administrator, that I interacted with Ms. Cummings as she and the Board of Governors identified and prioritized areas of need at St. Rose's which our Alumni Associations then sought to address. We had the good fortune to work on several projects, for example the refurbished basketball court, which are evident around the school today.


Ms. Cummings was very generous with expressions of appreciation for all projects completed. Despite her busy and demanding schedule, she took the time to keep alumni informed of progress and activities at the school by copy of her annual Principal Report which she presented each year at Graduation and Prize Giving Ceremonies in November, as well as with the occasional letter, and sometimes a surprise 'Thank You' plaque from the students. In one of her last emails to us, Ms. Cummings commented on the performance of St. Rose's students at the 2013 CSEC's, which was the last External Exams that she oversaw as Principal of St. Rose's. She reported, "Once again, continuing the legacy of success, St. Rose's High School has performed exceptionally well at the 2013 Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate Examinations and beaten out Bishop's High School and St. Stanislaus College to take the spot as second best performing school at the CSEC 2013 Examination after Queen's College."

I feel blessed to have known and worked with this dutiful daughter, proud parent, mindful student and dedicated Head Mistress of St. Rose's !"

Our active Alumni Association has flourished over the past years and our goals could not have been achieved without the generosity and support of our Alumni members and the commitment, hard work and dedication of our Executive Committee members. St. Rose's High School has benefitted tremendously from the various fund raising events that were held, resulting in a marked improvement in the high standard of education that the students have achieved, both in Academics and Sports. Here is a summary of the disbursement of monies to our Alma Mater from 2005 to 2015 in the following categories —

Toronto Chapter 25th Anniversary Essay Competition Prizes -\$450.00....Assistance to Individual Students providing Backpacks of stationery supplies and toiletries— \$986.00....Assistance with Airfares for Cricket Team representing St. Rose's in Barbados at the Garfield Sobers Cup Competition - \$3,610.00.... Compensation to Staff: providing Custodian fees (alternating with the U.S. Chapter), one-time emergency compensation for School Counsellor, one-time compensation for I.T. teacher (prior to this position being fully funded by the Government), one-time compensation for security coverage, special one-time Teacher honorarium - \$18, 996.00.... 2015 Reunion Seed Money Donation and NU2U Shipment -\$1,655.00....St. Ann's and St. John Bosco Orphanages (proceeds of annual games evenings)-\$8,517.00....Uncle Eddie's Home (special Brunch collection at our 25th Anniversary in 2012) -\$755.00....2005 Guyana Flood Relief -\$1,300.00....Canadian Charities (mandated portion of Last Lime profit) -\$1,074...Hurricane Katrina special collection -\$105.00. The total amount expended is \$158,250.00.

Margaret (Man-Son-Hing) Levy

Earlier this year, Guyanese-born Professor and a Scholar of Linguistics, Walter Edwards, visited Guyana. He was invited to speak to an audience who were delighted with his theory of "Reduplication in Guyanese Speech." The older citizens were filled with nostalgia as he regaled them with half-forgotten expressions of Guyanese Creolese such as: "Eh-eh; bam-bam, bun-bun, lef-lef, pim-pim, dan-dan, putta-putta and din-din."

Professor Edwards pointed out that "reduplicated words such as back-back (back-up) and one-one (one at a time) are consistent with morphological trends among African languages, and thus reveal part of the linguistic heritage of Guyanese speech".

He is also the Director of the Humanities Center, at Wayne State University, U.S.A.

FROM THE MAILBAG:






